Department's Comments: Religious Studies is engaged in ongoing consultation and brainstorming with graduate programs in Social Sciences and Humanities to collaborate and build upon areas of research strength. Specifically, Religious Studies has created the Islamic Studies Network (ISN), a group of faculty from departments in both Social Sciences and Humanities who share teaching and research interests in Islamic Studies. Members of the ISN are now associate members of the Department who can advise and serve as committee members for graduate students in the area. The department has also created a new area of graduate study, Theory Religion Politics (TRP), and deleted two areas (Religion and Politics, Western Religious Thought) which are no longer viable due to faculty retirements. The new TRP area includes faculty from the Faculty of Social Sciences and Faculty of Humanities who share research and teaching expertise in this area.
Dean's Comments: This has been an area of considerable focus for the current Chair of Religious Studies, with some notable success. In addition to those noted above, there have been efforts to reach out to health-oriented units at McMaster. There is more work to do, and this remains an on-going priority.

Department's Comments:

orming a consortium of institutions to offer language instruction continues to be bureaucratically complex. However, in the Spring/Summer 2025 terms Religious Studies is offering (online) Biblical Hebrew and Sanskrit, advertised as a "Summer Language Institute." Staff in the Department have worked very hard to advertise the availability of these courses and the possibility of using the Letter of Permission form by students from other Ontario universities to enrol in them. We are doing our best to move this project forward with the tools at hand.

The department is taking action in this area, as described above. This summer is the first attempt at this new approach. If it is not successful, the department will have to explore more formal arrangements with regional institutions to support advance language training.

Student feedback and faculty insights are key to monitoring the one-year MA degree's PLO and DLE's in relation to those of the two-year MA degree. Following the completion of our first cohort enrolled in the one-year MA, we invited staff from the MacPherson Institute to carry out a debrief with those students. As our second cohort is very small (1 student, due to an mid-term departure from the program, one student who moved into the two-year MA, and one student who moved directly into the PhD program), obtaining additional student and faculty feedback will take place next year (summer 2026).

Department's Comments:
<p>Work to foster a positive and inclusive department community is ongoing. "Coffee hour chats" during which a faculty member speaks to interested students about their research are ongoing; GAC chair meets regularly with GSARS representatives. Over the past year, instead of organizing targeted graduate student events that risk being poorly attended, we are integrating graduate students into other departmental activities, e.g., undergraduate public events. We also work to recognize our graduate students' achievements; for example, we have recently hosted a book launch event to celebrate the publication of a student's book. Moreover, we regularly share information about campus events that could be of interest to our students promoting their participation in the faculty of social sciences activities and beyond.</p>
Dean's Comments:
<p>This is an on-going challenge across the Faculty and the University due to the reduced presence of faculty (and, to a lesser degree, graduate students) in departments. Casual interactions are less likely to occur and therefore much be intentionally programmed through the types of events identified in the Chair's response above.</p>

Department's Comments: We strongly encourage graduate students to avail themselves of all resources for professional development offered through MacPherson. We also seek out and create opportunities for skills

development for our graduate students. For example, we have organized and participated teaching assistant workshops with other departments in order to pool resources and together create effective opportunities for our graduate students.

Dean's Comments:

The Faculty of Social Science believes that enhanced graduate professionalization and careers programming is essential. From the Faculty's perspective, it does not make sense to have each graduate program undertake its own professional development training in an uncoordinated manner. The Faculty of Social Sciences Associate Dean of Graduate Studies has been increasing professionalization training offered by the Faculty to students in all Social Science graduate programs (and for some events has also been working collaboratively with other Faculties at McMaster). This approach reduces unnecessary duplication, enables programming not possible for a single graduate program, and creates the benefits of greater interaction of graduate students across Social Science graduate programs. This Faculty-based programming can then be supplemented by program-specific programming that reflects considerations unique to a field.

This goal is difficult to achieve at this particular economic moment. When we admit international students we also offer those students additional information (that we have authored) regarding the costs of living in Hamilton as well as opportunities to connect to current graduate students in the program.

Dean's Comments:

The University has in recent years increased dedicated supports for international students (funded in part by an international student tax paid by Faculties). In addition, a staff member in the School of

Graduate Studies focuses on supporting international graduate students. While more can always be done, these resources represent a considerable investment by the university in supporting international students.
